The **Life Skills Development** Trainer is responsible to provide day to day direct care, support and behavioral modification services for individuals with developmental disabilities. The Trainer will assist individuals with developmental disabilities to achieve their potential. Life skills will include work skills, community work experiences as well as developmental skills training. This includes, but is not limited to training and coaching in occupational skills, socialization, personal hygiene and daily living. Life skills development Trainers are also fixed route drivers or back up drivers.
